2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NIV)

Your word is a lamp for my feet and a light for my path

Psalms 119:105 (NLT)

- What keeps you from following the Bible's teachings? What can you do to become more devoted?
- What keeps you from reading the Bible like you should? How can you remove these distractions?

Question 5: Is it okay to wear sexy clothes?

1 Timothy 2:9 (NLT)

Your beauty should not come from outward adornment...Instead, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight

1 Peter 3:3-4 (NIV)

- Why is it important for Christ-followers to be modest in how they dress?

Question 6 & 7: Why does God seem so different in the Old and New Testament and is there an unpardonable sin?

I am the LORD, and I do not change. That is why you descendants of Jacob are not already completely destroyed.

Malachi 3:6 (NLT)

And so I tell you, every sin and blasphemy will be forgiven men, but the blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven. Anyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but anyone who speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come.

Matthew 12:31-32 (NIV)

- What does the fact that God never changes mean to you?
- How has God's forgiveness and grace changed your life?
